



"Then Moses stood in the entrance of the camp, and said, "Whoever is on the LORD'S side – come to me"! Exodus 32:26

Recently I read an article on Facebook written by a friend of mine trying to persuade Christians that most were on the wrong side of things politically. For some reason, as I was reading his thoughts, the old hymn "Who is on the Lord's Side?" by Frances R. Havergal popped into my mind. I kept thinking, "Does it really matter that much what side of things we are on concerning politics?" I mean, we can always change sides; our leaders do it all the time. But when it comes to being on the Lord's side, that is a totally different thing. When we choose to follow Christ, as Bro. Dan preached recently, the Holy Spirit puts His seal on our hearts. We can't just switch sides.

So I guess we need to ask the question "What is the Lord's side?" According to Scripture, the LORD's side is the side of forgiveness, mercy, healing, hope, and love. Anything in life that does not include these things probably is the wrong side. Yes, we know that one day Jesus will come back in vengeance and justice. With one word, all of His enemies will fall. But the authors of Scripture teach us that NOW is the time of grace and mercy, not justice. So, how do we practice grace in a world filled with so much hate and confusion? The hymn writer gives us some clues by asking more questions "Who will serve the KING? Who will be His helper? Who will leave the world's side? Who for Him will go?" Then she answers with "by . . mercy, by His love, joyfully."

So to me, the most important question I can ask myself when I get confused about what is going on in my world is "Am I on the LORD'S side"? Am I practicing grace, forgiveness and love? Am I showing mercy and compassion? Or am I adding to the fray and confusion?
