


Meredith and I appreciate the opportunity to attend the Mississippi Baptist Convention (MBC) last week. It was so encouraging to hear what is going on around our state and the impact Mississippi churches are making. Outside of the business of the convention, we got to hear some great preaching and be a part of some powerful worship.

This year marked the 100th anniversary of the Cooperative Program (CP). "The CP is Southern Baptists' unified plan of giving through which cooperating Southern Baptist churches give a percentage of their undesignated receipts in support of their respective state convention and the Southern Baptist Convention missions and ministries" (sbc.net). The money Mississippi churches give to the Cooperative Program goes to the ministries of the MBC and then to the ministries of the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC). The MBC estimated churches in Mississippi would give almost \$31 million to the CP this year. A little over \$18 million will stay in Mississippi to support ministries like the Baptist universities and collegiate ministries, disaster relief, the Baptist Children's Village, and the work of the MBC across our state. The remaining money will be sent to the SBC to support the Internal National Mission Board, the North American Mission Board, theological education, operations of the SBC, and the Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission. While we cannot see every way this money impacts lives for the gospel, I am thankful for the impact our church gets to make through the CP.
